Hold the system accountable

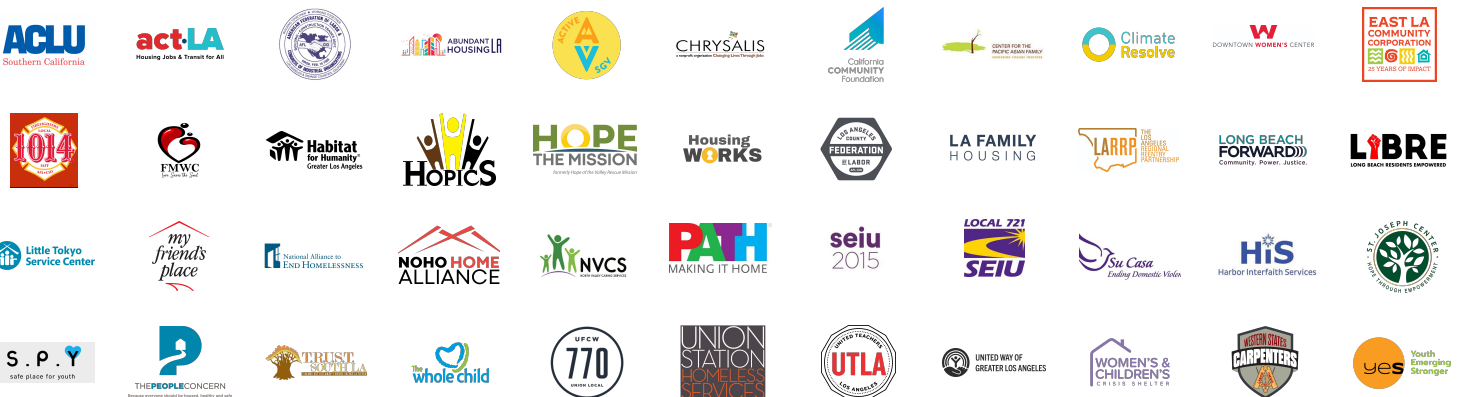
Requires progress toward specific objectives with strict tracking, audits, and consequences for missed goals
